## Open questions

- 1. In this context, a constraint is something the interface does not afford. One can think of various constraints on a webpage, a button can only be pressed down, it cannot be pulled up. The scrollbar cannot be dragged below or above its ends.
- Explicit knowledge is knowledge the participant is aware of, the so-called known knowns.
   This can be discovered using a survey as participants will self report this knowledge.
   Implicit knowledge is knowledge participants have and are unaware of, the so-called unknown knowns. This knowledge cannot be discovered using a survey and requires contextual inquiry.
